

raise God from whom all blessings flow!" We Redeemerites are truly blessed! Already 500 years ago in his

explanation to the Apostles' Creed, Martin Luther listed the blessings of "body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, . . . also clothing and shoes, meat and drink, house and home, spouse and children, fields, cattle, and all my goods; that He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life." Except perhaps for "fields and cattle," most of us possess those other items, and we should thank God daily for them.

Most important of all though, we should thank God for His plan of salvation, which is available to all of us. It doesn't matter how much money we have or how intelligent we are or how talented or athletic we are. Every one of us is God's dearly beloved child. Every one of us is a sinner who needs God's undeserved forgiveness. Every one of us can be with Jesus forever in heaven. ALL that God asks is that we put Him first and foremost in our life. [That's a big "ALL."]

At Redeemer Lutheran School, we are *Preparing Christian Leaders*. And as we teach the children the various subject areas, we also make sure that God's saving grace permeates our teaching. My weekly letter to the staff is entitled "Learning with Love," and that is what we share with our school children on a daily basis. Every Redeemer staff member should *exude warmth*, and if you are not feeling that warmth from a staff person, please talk with her/him about it.

Many of our church members have never taken the opportunity to come into the school buildings. I invite you, church members, to call our office and schedule a tour with me. We have so much for which to thank God that I love to show it to people on tours. A tour is one way to learn first-hand just what is happening in our wonderful school.

August 13 is "staff dedication Sunday," and August 15 is the first day of school. I like to compare the school year of 180 days with a baseball season of 162 games—our season is about to begin. Jerome Ruiz and his assistants, Kyle and Kevin, are sprucing up the classrooms and hallways. Our new playground is completed. We have a new roof on Bussert Hall (the extended care building) and a re-coating of the gym floor. Due to an increase in student population, we ordered some new desks. We have a new social studies series in Kindergarten-grade 3 and another new series for Florida History in grade 4. Picture runners at the starting line of a race—we wait with eager anticipation for the starting gun to be fired on August 15.

Thank you, church members, for all that you have done and continue to do to make Redeemer Lutheran the best school around! May God bless our 2017-2018 school year abundantly! To God be the glory—great things He has done!


