They have worked very hard to prepare their crosses, and they are excited to share them with their families, friends, and fellow worshipers. We have been studying the symbolism of each cross, and we are thankful most of all for Jesus' love for us!

In celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, we'll continue the series on Martin Luther and the theological truths he espoused in his teachings. Above to Earth I Come. Every year Luther provided Christmas Eve entertainment for his family. He wrote this hymn in 1534 and modeled its opening lines on the song "Aus Fremden Landen Komm' Ich Her." It is said that Luther celebrated the festival in his own house in this fashion: by his orders, the first seven verses of the hymn were sung by a man dressed as an angel, whom the children greeted with the 8th and following verses.
