In celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, we'll continue the series on Martin Luther and the theological truths he espoused in his teachings. Today we'll focus on the blessing and grace that is Holy Communion REFORMATION



and how Luther encouraged active participation in worship by the lay people. Each week we'll also sing a hymn written by Luther. Today's hymn is O Lord, We Praise You. The first stanza of this hymn was written in the 15th century and used as a post-communion hymn. Luther wrote stanzas two and three and published them in 1524. This hymn was a favorite of Luther and his people and has been a favorite in Lutheran Churches since then. The tune is that of an old German folk-tune.
