The members of Redeemer Lutheran Church and School have spent the last several months giving input and considering how we can best use God's resources as we move into the future. Thanks to those who participated in this information-gathering process, we found that our

members are fairly united in their thoughts. Our priorities were identified and, in November, the voters approved a capital campaign in order to raise funds for three purposes:

- Pay down our mortgage in order to free up monies for other expenses and mission programs
- Make needed repairs to our facility
- Fund missions and other outreach opportunities

Preliminary work had already been done on fundraising options, and so we were prepared to call upon Wittenberg Church Consultants to begin leading us in our capital campaign.



We hit the ground running in early December in order to have the entire campaign in front of the congregation while our seasonal members were among us. Recruitment began with our four dedicated and capable Co-Directors, Russ Reaver, Jack Gebhardt, and Steve and Karen McCarthy. Leaders for

the various campaign teams followed and we held our first training meeting on December 7 & 8. The first order of business for the team leaders was to identify the Case Statement for the campaign.

The Case Statement is the succinct, scriptural and inspiring statement of what the campaign intends to accomplish. The Case Statement for our capital campaign is printed below. With our purpose already set for us by our members, we simply needed to give it some detail, fill it with inspiration and make sure it was grounded and centered on Christ.

Please take a moment to read and digest the case statement. We'll be returning to it again and again in the weeks ahead.

Case Statement

Crossing the Bridge to the Future...Together

Our members, school families and visitors cross many bridges to come to Redeemer, whether year round or for a season. Bridges take us places. Bridges allow us to move past or over challenging terrain. Over time, our bridges also need care and maintenance.

Redeemer Lutheran Church and School is facing some challenging terrain to cross. Christ and His cross are able to bridge any terrain no matter how rough the waves or how much the tide surges.

God chooses each of us to be stewards of His resources at Redeemer. We have some mission-related capital improvements to address, a debt repayment bridge to cross that will free up future offerings, and a wealth of mission opportunities to span. All these will help us increase support for our mission of "reaching out into the community to be the best for the community."

Before we cross this stewardship bridge, God is challenging us and supporting us in greater commitment to His word and sacraments. With this increased faith, let's cross this bridge to the future...together.

For over 50 years Redeemer has been reaching out in faith to bring God's Word to our members, our school families and those in the community. We have come together as a congregation to accomplish great things for God's kingdom. When we set our minds to a project, our members respond with amazing energy and generosity. We pray that our "CROSSING THE BRIDGE TO THE FUTURE...TOGETHER" campaign will also bring us together as we raise funds to accomplish our shared goals.

That is why our "CROSSING THE BRIDGE TO THE FUTURE...TOGETHER" campaign will have two distinct phases: spiritual and stewardship.

During the first few weeks of the campaign, we will focus on our life as Christians and what it means to

be a child of God and a member of this church. We call this time the "Wilderness" because we ask each member to spend time in prayer and contemplation.

You will receive a booklet describing Spiritual Exercises that will help you to strengthen your faith and a "Spiritual Pledge Sheet" to complete and turn in on Spiritual Pledge Sunday, February 17.

It will only be after we have all given thought and commitment to our spiritual lives that we will begin to speak and learn more about our personal stewardship and the financial needs of this campaign.

So please take two journeys with your fellow members, spiritual and stewardship, in the next three months.

Campaign Guided by Wittenberg Church Consultants

The members of Redeemer are being guided in the "CROSSING THE BRIDGE TO THE FUTURE...TOGETHER" stewardship campaign by Wittenberg Church Consultants out of Naperville, Illinois.

The Rev. Dr. Tim Rossow is heading up the preparations and training and has written many of the materials that will be used in the campaign. Pastor Rossow has served in the pastoral ministry for over 25 years and received his Doctor of Ministry Degree in Church Organization from Concordia, Fort Wayne.

Donna Linnemeyer has done congregational program administration for the past 18 years and has a degree in Business Administration.

Pastor Rossow and Donna Linnemeyer have conducted and designed stewardship programs for their own congregation and are now sharing their experience with other churches. They bring the unique perspective of "having sat where you are sitting" to the campaign process. They truly enjoy sharing their insights and helping congregations with planning, renewal and stewardship programs.

Says Pastor Rossow, "Early on we found that the most important component in a campaign is spiritual growth. Our goal is to get every member at Redeemer to examine where they stand in relation to the cross of Christ. Once that happens, everything else falls into place."

"Quiet on the Set . . . Action!" Watch for a brief burst of video cameras around Redeemer as our "CROSSING THE BRIDGE TO THE FUTURE...TOGETHER" campaign kicks off. A short video is planned as part of the campaign to give us some background, inspire us and tell us about the purpose and goals of the campaign.
