



Please Welcome Pastor Edward (Ted) Andrada



Heritage & Childhood: I am the 3rd straight generation in my family to serve as clergy in the LCMS. The clergy side (my mother's side) came from Germany. Grandpa Dahms served a congregation of 4,000 members in Chicago, Illinois. My father's parents came from Norway and the Philippine Islands. My Norwegian grandmother was called to Heaven two years before I was born and my Filipino grandfather remarried, this time to a Filipino woman whom I grew up knowing as my grandma. Grandpa Ben was known as the man who was everybody's friend and a man who loved to play stringed instruments. Throughout my childhood and my college years I lived in Minnetonka, MN., a western suburb of Minneapolis. Both of my parents were public school teachers. My father was an elder and played Dart ball in our congregation and my mother taught Bible study as well as Jr. High Sunday School for 17 years. We attended worship and Sunday School every week.



When I was 12, my father died due to complications of Diabetes, which for the previous 4 years saw him spending equal time in a hospital bed and his own bed at home. Due to medical expenses, we declared bankruptcy. This led me to be very responsible at a young age, cooking, cleaning and caring for my younger brother when my mother was at work or at the hospital with my father. My godfather, "Uncle Ed" from Chicago and our pastor served as excellent role models for me. My older sister (by 7 years) moved out of the house when I was 11 years old.

Education: During my years at Concordia College (now University) in St. Paul, MN. God drew me closer to Him through several professors and clergy. I began to study as a business major which changed to an education major and then pre-seminary. I did not grow up wanting to be a pastor but was drawn into it slowly over the years. I graduated with a B.A. in Social Science and was very close to minors in Language and Business.

At seminary I continued to grow and expand interests in missions and multicultural ministry. I had begun studying Spanish in Jr. High and this interest led me to serve a vicarage in a Spanish speaking congregation in Miami, FL. I also served in an English-speaking vicarage. On Call Day I was surprised to find that I was being sent to an African American congregation in the deep south. During this time my interests in Pastoral Leadership and Administration began to grow.

Ministry: During my "settled ministry" I served 5 congregations, each one being the equivalent to a secular "job promotion." I went from being the Sole pastor in a small congregation to Assistant Pastor in a large congregation, to Sr. Pastor in a medium sized congregation, to Sr. Pastor in a very large congregation to Sr. Pastor in another very large congregation. I have led 5 ministry building projects. I have baptized, taught, confirmed, married and buried thousands of people. I have significant experience in travelling overseas for missions in Africa, Mexico, and the Bering Strait of Alaska. I have also attended our LCMS National Youth Gatherings since 1983. Along the way I have enjoyed ministering to many people and making many friends with whom I still keep in contact to this day. I have also been blessed to meet and become friends with amazing clergy in our synod from whom I have gleaned a great deal of wisdom and insight.



Marriage & Family: Jacquie and I wed in Columbus, OH. and will celebrate our 30th anniversary this August 4. We make our home in Plymouth, MN (west suburb of Minneapolis). We are blessed with 4 adult children within 4 years of each other. Blaine (a computer engineer) is married to Siobhan and resides in Sheboygan, WI. Grant, Austin and Kate (the twins) are in college.

Cancer: My wife is now 6 years cancer free after major cancer surgery. My mother's second husband (who my children knew as "Grandpa Eddie") and years later my mother were called to heaven after suffering through the cancer battle. When my mother was given a 3-month life sentence from her doctor, my wife and I decided to move back to Minnesota and live in family housing for 3 months while a congregation in Texas was going through the process to Call me as their Sr. Pastor. It seemed like a good transition, but God had other plans. The congregation Called me, but my mother was not dying as quickly as doctors had surmised. I declined the Call, and we bought a house and let our children complete H.S. in a very good school district. My mother lived almost 4 more years with good health until God called her home.





During this time, I received the “Intentional Interim Ministry Training” and have served 5 local congregations as Interim. Over my years of previous ministry, I also served as Vacancy Pastor to 4 congregations before I was trained. One of my 4 children is newly married (Blaine to Siobhan) and the other 3 (Grant, Austin and Kate) are graduated from Wayzata H.S. last fall and currently study at Concordia University in Wisconsin. This frees me up from local “Dad duties” and I have taken the “willing to travel 60-mile tether from my home” off my Intentional Interim Ministry listing. My wife (Jacquie) is a store manager for Walmart in the Twin Cities. We have a strong relationship and common goals.

Weaknesses & Strengths: Since my ordination 28 years ago I have learned a lot about myself and how God has wired me. I am not good at writing newsletters, filling out reports, remembering passwords or computer programming. My filing system makes sense to me, each paper has a place in a pile on my desk. For many tasks I have learned to rely on good support staff. My strengths include understanding people systems, I love preaching and worship, understand healthy systems and processes of the Church. I am especially good at using healthy process to lead a congregation in goal setting and realizing the increase of income that accompanies “getting things on track” with Jesus on His mission.

Current Personal/Professional Interests: Jacquie and I continue to be strong believers in the value of quality education and Lutheran Schools. Each year I am the Championship Game announcer and occasional cameraman at the Lutheran Basketball Association of America’s (LBAA) “Tournament of Champions.” I also have a place in my heart for church workers. According to recent Barna Research findings, “1,700 clergy are leaving pastoral ministry each month in the U.S.” and “70% of Pastors do not have someone they consider a close friend.” I have helped a number of church workers through difficult transitions and serve one week each year as Chaplain for “Shepherd’s Canyon Retreats” outside of Phoenix, Arizona. I am also a proponent of church leaders “sharpening their swords” by the attending “Best Practices For Ministry” conference each year at which I have been a presenter.



I look forward to working with the leaders and members of Redeemer in the days to come. It is my hope and prayer that God will use me to be a blessing, as He has so graciously blessed me throughout my life.

Classroom Connection

January finds middle school plugging away and students are often bored during this month. But one bright spot that the students and teachers look forward to is our big class trip! The entire middle school will go to Marine Lab in Key Largo this April and the students are excited for everything they will do and learn. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the unique marine ecology found in the Keys, snorkel in the estuary, observe and learn about the invertebrates found in the estuary, snorkel in John Pennekamp State Park, learn to identify Florida's fish, snorkel some more—and many more activities. It is an amazing opportunity to learn more about this unique part of God's creation. Pictures are from 2 years ago but the students are so excited for this year's trip!

We have started a new program this year. Kindergarten through 8th grade students and teachers are now part of chapel families. Chapel families sit together each week during worship and once a month we take the opportunity to spend about half an hour together completing a devotion and an activity—all focused on the idea of discipleship and what it means to be a disciple of Christ. Ladies Spring Rally, **March 18, 8:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.** at Redeemer.






