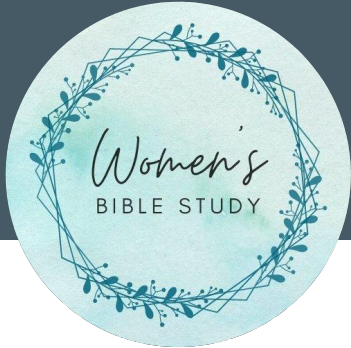

Why Volunteer?

- In the church I was baptized and confirmed in, it was sort of a “Rite of Passage” to start ushering. After confirmation, we were technically adults, taking communion and becoming a new voting member of the congregation. So, it was my first volunteer job in a church and represented my comfort zone when I moved around to the various churches I attended while in the Navy, since most services seemed to operate about the same.

The first day of the Lent season, sometimes known as Lententide, is Ash Wednesday. This year it fell on February 18. Some might think that this is early, but wait until next year - Ash Wednesday is on February 10! By the time you read this column we are well into Lent. On Ash Wednesday we remembered that we are sinful creatures and that our sins condemn us to an eternity separated from the Father. We were marked with the sign of the cross on our foreheads to remind us that we will return to dust - until we step over that threshold into eternal life because of our faith in Jesus!

During this period of Lent (all of March) consider increasing your prayer life, attending our Wednesday evening Dinner and Devotion, hosted by Tim Mirly, and reflecting on our sinfulness and repenting of our sins. Principally Speaking

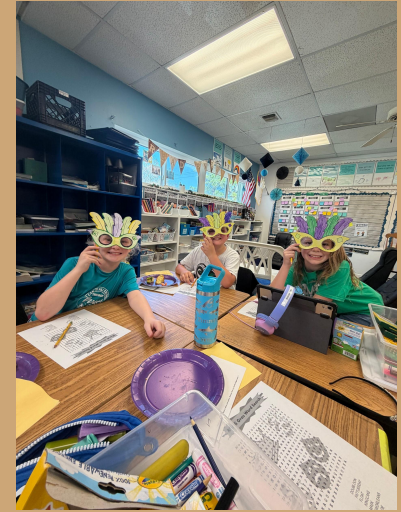
